superpowers? What are some superpowers you could work on a little?


As we go into Summer 2016, please know that in Cascade, MD we will be working on our superpowers and of course, using them for good – the good that we learn at Camp Louise!

Recipe: The Perfect Brownie

By: Rachel Gutin Medvin (Circle 2005)

Ingredients:

3/4 cup cocoa

1/2 teaspoon baking soda

2/3 cup vegetable oil

1/2 cup boiling water (measure accurately)

2 cups sugar

2 eggs

1 1/3 cups unsifted all-purpose flour

1 teaspoon vanilla

1/4 teaspoon salt

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
- 2. Stir cocoa and baking soda in a medium bowl.
- 3. Blend in 1/3 cup vegetable oil.
- 4. Add flour, vanilla and salt; blend completely.
- 5. Pour into lightly greased 13 x 9 x 2" pan or 8" square pans.
- 6. Bake at 350 degrees fahrenheit for 35 to 40 minutes for 12 x 9 x 2", 30 to 32 minutes for 8" square pans. 7. Cool; frost, if desired.

Yields about 3 dozen brownies.
